




# The message of Co-representative

“The UN World Conference against Racism (DURBAN Conference 2001) held from August through September, 2001 in DURBAN of South Africa adopted “the DURBAN declaration and Programme of Action” on September 8, the last day of the conference. The international community thought that it can finally say farewell to “the 20th century of war and genocide” and put up big hope of eliminating racial and gender discrimination to realize the dialog between different civilizations in the 21st century where there would be no wars or genocide.

However, in three days after the declaration, the World Trade Center collapsed with the roaring sound in New York.
